

HEART MONITOR DONATION TO CARDIOLOGY...

We are absolutely delighted to receive the superb portable heart monitor kindly donated presented to our cardiology ward in University Hospital of North Durham.

Pictured here receiving the new heart monitor is senior cardiographer Jacqui Poulton with Fred Richards presenting on behalf of Chester-le-Street Hospital Community & Friends.

Jacqui said, 'These monitors record heartbeats over a period of 24 hours, and because they are so small they allow patients to go home and continue to go about their everyday activities. The recordings are then downloaded the next day. The data collected is analysed by a specialist cardiac healthcare science practitioner, allowing them to examine the rhythm of the heart in great detail. They are used particularly with patients who have palpitations, or who have a heart condition which puts them at risk of developing a serious heart rhythm problem. They are also used as part of the screening pathway in patients who have suffered a stroke so we are very grateful for the support from Fred and the wider Friends team.

Fred said, 'On behalf of the Chester Le Street Hospital and Friends group, we are delighted to be able to help with the purchase of this new monitor and hope it will help others in our community.'
